Being on time for school:

A reminder that children should arrive between 8:45am - 8.55am through the Church Hill Road gate. Gates will be locked at 8:55am and after this time, children arriving via the Littlegrove entrance will be marked as 'late'. Please ensure that you arrive in sufficient time for your child to be in class by 8.55am each day.

Scooters:

Scooters are a great way to get to school and are a brilliant alternative to travelling by car. We do have a scooter park in the playground should you wish to leave your child's scooter here.

Please remind your child to dismount from their scooter before they come through the gate in the morning. At home time, children should not ride their scooter in the playground; instead they should wait until they are off the school site. This is particularly important as the playground is often very busy at these times.


Books in school:

As an alternative to the Amazon wish list, we have also worked with the Children's Book Shop in Muswell Hill to create a collection of St Mary's class wish lists: <u>https://www.childrensbookshoplondon.com/wishlists</u>. Once purchases are made, The Children's Bookshop will send books to school once a week for free, labelled with the child's name and class, but parents are also welcome to go into the shop and browse if they'd rather and take it with them immediately.

Cases of COVID-19 in school:

Unfortunately, and as expected, we have had some cases of Covid in school since we have been back. Here is the advice from the NHS regarding a child that tests positive for COVID-19:

- They should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day **after** they did the test.
- If they're well and do not have a temperature after 3 days, there's a much lower risk that they'll pass on COVID-19 to others so can return to normal activities.
