To mark the King's Coronation, thousands of organisations across the country are getting together to give people the chance to help out in their own local communities.

Starting on Monday 8th May there will be opportunities for anyone who'd like to, to join in. The Big Help Out!

No matter what you are good at, there'll be something to suit helping hands of all shapes and sizes! From checking in on someone who'd like a bit of company or volunteering for a charity the more of us who join in, the bigger help we will be.

While tons of business waste goes to landfill, local charities are struggling to deliver the services your community needs. Every year, tons of unwanted business items go to landfill.

According to a recent study, approximately 1.2 million desks and 1.6 million office chairs end up in landfill each year. The study couldn't count the amount of IT equipment, branded merchandise, surplus products and other items that also go to landfill, but if it could, we're sure the number would be heart breaking.

What are we up to in school? See if you can spot the theme...!

- YR children will be creating Union Jack flags to use for their celebrations this weekend (whilst wearing their Coronation crowns).
- Y2 are going to make their own version of the new King Charles Stamp, using a profile of King Charles and collages of colourful paper (whilst wearing their Coronation crowns).
 This ties in beautifully with their visit to the Postal Museum and history unit of work.
- Y3 have already been learning about what will happen during the coronation ceremony including talking about the history of the coronation services and Westminster Abbey. They have already made links to how the other planned events for the weekend link with volunteering and community building. Y3 also explored the coronation anthem 'Zadok the Priest' and discussed the way the conductor signals the orchestra and singers to vary the dynamics of the music. (They will be wearing their Coronation crowns too!)
- Y4 will be learning about the King's crown and the symbolism of the jewels placed in it. They will be getting creative and creating their own careful observational drawings of the King's crown (whilst wearing their Coronation crowns).

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- Y5 will be making beautiful bunting to decorate the classroom along with doing some collaborative coronation themed creative activities (whilst wearing their Coronation crowns).

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- Y6 will be having a post SATs and Coronation celebration on the afternoon of Friday 12th May. The children will be having some party snacks and drinks along with some music, dancing and merriment (whilst wearing their Coronation crowns).

A Coronation gift for the children:

To mark the momentous occasion, the Governing Body of St. Mary's school have generously bought a commemorative pin badge for every child. The children will come home with them by the end of this week; please support them to look after this special item. They could wear it on a school jumper, coat, a school bag for example.





Our Coronation Song:

We will be proudly performing a special Coronation song on May Day for you all. The children have already been working hard, rehearsing this so that their performance will be fit for a king!

News from St Mary's Church:

On Sunday at St Mary's Church the congregation will be planting a special commemorative tree, and everyone will sow wild flower seeds to bring colour and new life to the churchyard in honour of the coronation!

Save the date for a super children's party at St Mary's Church on 16th May. As Christian Aid's aim is to raise


Wishing Year 6 all the very best of luck for their SATs next week! We know how very hard you have all worked and that you'll do really well.
