Dear Parents and Carers,

We've had a superb month in school and it's been a pleasure to welcome the Reception children into our St. Mary's family. There's lots to tell you and some important dates to share, so please read carefully!

Collective Worship:

Our focus for this half term's collective worship is all about having a Heart for the Earth. Inspired by our vision to care for all of God's creation, we have been learning about climate change and climate justice. Immersing ourselves in Genesis chapter 1, we have reflected on the beauty of God's world and how over time, people have sadly done things to spoil it.



Our learning about climate justice has helped the children to understand how unfair it is that it's often the case that people and communities who do the least to contribute to climate change, that are the most affected by it.

We are dedicated to supporting the children to demonstrate an active responsibility to challenge injustice wisely. Please keep an eye on the Y1-Y6 Google Classrooms as I'll be inviting the children to create a poster on the theme of climate injustice, as part of a <u>Christian Aid project</u>. The posters will be shared with global leaders (attending COP 28) in an exhibition at the Houses of Parliament. Our children will potentially have the opportunity to affect thinking and change, which is very exciting!

Harvest Festival:

On Monday 2nd October, we will be celebrating Harvest festival in school. Please give what you can – all donations will be split between the Chipping Barnet Food Bank and Homeless Action in Barnet. We ask for donations to be brought to the school hall as the children arrive for school on Monday morning. Please bring donations in a strong plastic bag as we will donate these too.

Just One Tree Day:

As part of our commitment to climate change, we will be marking Just One Tree Day. JUST ONE TIREE. Just One Tree is a non-profit organisation whose mission is removing CO2 from the atmosphere through global reforestation.

The aim is that the tree absorbs CO2, restores biodiversity and makes the world a better place. Another incredible aspect of the reforestation process is the ability to improve the lives of those living in challenging conditions. Trees are planted in various locations, including Brazil, Haiti, Madagascar and more.

Why should we plant more trees?

- Trees absorb the pollutants we humans put into the atmosphere.
- They clean the air we breathe, filter the water we drink, prevent soil erosion and flooding, give life
 to the world's wildlife, house complex ecosystems, supply us with medicine and provide jobs to
 over 1.6 billion people.
- They really are the superheroes of the planet and we need them in order to survive. 'Just One Tree Day' is Friday 13th October this will be a non-uniform day.

Messy Church- Messy Harvest:


