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Local ju-jitsu club:

Might your child be interested in learning a martial art form? Brazilian Jiu Jitsu is a ground based grappling art that uses movement to either a) create space or b) take it away. Often, the two are used in conjunction to control the movement of another person who may be significantly stronger than the grappler, but does not understand how to use their body in the same way. Another great benefit of jiu-jitsu training is that it is relatively low impact - No punches/kicking to the face.
