## **Governors: A message from Stephen Edwards, Chair of Governors**

The Governors of St Mary's play a wide and varied role in school life – we have a strategic role, working with Mrs Constantinou to set the overall vision for the school and determine priorities into the future. We also work hard to scrutinise and understand the operation of the school on a day to day basis, both through our regular governors' meetings, and through visits looking at specific areas of school life.

For example, this week, a group of governors visited the school to hear from pupils and staff about the geography curriculum, and last week, Mrs Constantinou and I met the local police and Cllr Simon Radford to discuss how we can work together to ensure the school and its community continues to be safe and secure.

As a voluntary aided school, we also – via the generous contributions of parents through annual contributions – fund improvement projects around the school. Recent projects have included significant work to the school roof over the summer, new fire doors throughout the school, and improvements to the school's security system. We can reclaim tax on these donations through the Government's Gift Aid Scheme, enabling us to fund further improvements into the school environment. There are further details of how to do this on the <u>parental contributions section</u> of the school website. Donations can be made using School Money where payments for trips are made.

Governors are always keen to hear from parents (and pupils!) about their experiences of the school – so do please feel free to write to me, care of the school office, if you wish.

## Collective worship – focus value:

This half term, in the run up to Easter and during Lent, we have been thinking about Service, which has led on beautifully from the wonderful work many of the children did in Hope-anuary. We have reflected on the skills and talents that we have and how we might use those to serve others. Here are a few of the children's ideas:

Our skills, talents, interests and qualities:	How these could be used to serve others:
Being good at singing e.g. being in a choir or singing well at home.	Making others feel happy and joyful when we sing to them e.g. when the choir sing to vulnerable or elderly community members.
Being observant.	Noticing if someone is feeling down, offering to help or finding someone who can.
Good at gardening	Growing fruit, vegetables or plants and flowers to give to others.
Having a love for reading.	Reading to others, helping friends to read and telling stories we've read.
Knowing how to play a sport like football or rugby.	Teaching someone the rules of the game and how to play safely.
Being a good dancer.	Perfuming for others to make them smile and teaching friends new dance moves!
Have good knowledge in a subject at school.	Offering to explain or show something to another child who might be finding it tricky.
Being generous with time for	Spending time to help others in need.
others and ourselves.	Recognising when a friend might be tired and doing a job for them. Invite another child to play if they look lonely. Taking time to share.

We have heard Bible stories showing Jesus serving unconditionally as servant king who did not come to be served, but to serve. Here is our 'service' memory verse for this half term:
